







# Casco Bay Estuary Partnership Habitat Protection Fund Spring 2020 Request for Proposals

#### **Overview**

Casco Bay Estuary Partnership (CBEP) is offering grants to support the permanent protection of targeted habitats in the Casco Bay watershed through its *Habitat Protection Fund* (Fund). The Fund will be administered by CBEP via the University of Southern Maine, in partnership with Maine Coast Heritage Trust (MCHT), Maine Dept. of Inland Fisheries & Wildlife (MDIFW), and U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service Gulf of Maine Coastal Program (USFWS). A minimum of \$20,000 is available this round.

Prospective applicants must provide parcel lot/map information to USFWS & CBEP by March 6, 2020. USFWS will then prepare a standard series of maps to accompany each proposal on a first come, first served basis. Completed proposals must be emailed to CBEP by 5:00 PM on April 3, 2020.

### **Fund Criteria**

- 1. Projects must be located within the Casco Bay watershed (see map), including the Calendar Islands.
- 2. The Fund aims to support protection of lands that are integral to aquatic ecosystems. Proposals should target property with one or more of the following characteristics:
  - a. Shoreline on tidal waters, small coastal streams, rivers, or perennial streams.
  - b. Tidal or freshwater wetlands, including floodplains and naturally occurring vernal pools.
  - c. Salt marsh migration corridors.
  - d. Focus areas designated by Beginning With Habitat (map; factsheets).
  - e. Conservation priorities identified by local, regional, or statewide habitat-focused plans.
- 3. **Grant funds must be expended by March 31, 2020** unless an alternate time frame is described in the proposal and agreed upon during the application process.
- 4. The Fund can be used to reimburse transaction costs (defined below) that predate this RFP, provided that: a) the cost was incurred between July 2019 February 2020, b) documentation of cost and completion are provided, and c) the acquisition is expected to close by December 31, 2020.
- 5. Grants can be awarded to tax-exempt 501(c)(3) conservation organizations or units of government.
- 6. Individual conservation projects are eligible to receive up to two awards from the Fund.

#### **Eligible Expenses**

- 1. <u>Transaction costs</u> such as boundary surveys, attorney fees, environmental assessments, appraisal costs, recording fees, and title expenses.
- 2. Purchase of a conservation easement on high value habitat.
- 3. Purchase of fee title to land with high value habitat.

Other costs associated with acquisition, such as stewardship endowments, will be considered in extraordinary cases if it is demonstrated that, without assistance, the project is unlikely to proceed.

#### **Grant Amount**

Individual grant awards will depend on the number and quality of proposals received, with a maximum award of \$10,000. At least \$20,000 is available through the Fund for this round.

#### **CBEP Habitat Protection Committee**

The Fund is administered by a Committee consisting of representatives of CBEP, USFWS, IFW and MCHT. Applicants may contact any of the individuals listed at the end of the RFP about the Fund.

# **Requirements for all Properties Protected**

- 1. All lands protected must be managed for habitat conservation in perpetuity. The applicant must sign a statement provided by CBEP ensuring permanent protection and management of the property for its natural resource values in perpetuity.
- 2. Public access, permitted in a manner sensitive to habitat values, must be assured in perpetuity due to the use of U.S. EPA federal funds. The applicant must sign a statement provided by CBEP ensuring permanent public access to the property. (NOTE: Rare exceptions may be granted where conservation value is especially high, and public access would undercut conservation goals.)
- 3. If intensive land management activities (e.g. forestry, agriculture) are envisioned on the property, those activities must be carried out in an ecologically sensitive manner, consistent with the overarching purpose of protecting high value habitat in perpetuity. Applicants anticipating intensive land management activities for non-habitat values must review these activities in the proposal and describe legal and other mechanisms for ensuring compliance with management goals.
- 4. In outreach efforts associated with land acquisition (e.g., written materials, public ceremonies, discussions with key partners), CBEP requests appropriate recognition as a partner involved in supporting the land protection initiative. CBEP will supply a logo for visual presentation purposes. In written materials, we request that "Casco Bay Estuary Partnership Habitat Protection Fund" be credited as co-administered in partnership with the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service Gulf of Maine Coastal Program, Maine Coast Heritage Trust, and the Maine Dept. of Inland Fisheries & Wildlife.
- 5. Although it is not a requirement to receive a grant through the Fund, the provision of non-federal matching funds for CBEP's federal contribution to any project is strongly encouraged. This commitment will need to be documented in writing on the organization's letterhead.

## **Application Process**

The process for applying is as follows:

- 1. Interested applicants are encouraged to start by contacting Matt Craig of CBEP.
- 2. Provide tax parcel lot/map information to USFWS and CBEP **by March 6th.** It may take at least two weeks to create maps. Maps will be prepared on a first come, first served basis.
- 3. Applicants should submit an electronic copy of the following information to CBEP by April 3rd:
  - a) Cover letter briefly describing project and requesting funds;
  - b) A completed Habitat Protection Fund application OR a pre-existing grant application with supplemental information as needed. All applicants must provide information from p.1 of the application form.
  - c) Series of habitat maps prepared by USFWS (#2, above);
  - d) An appraisal summary sheet or opinion of value, if available;
  - e) Budget outlining the total project costs, committed funds, and potential funding sources both for the project and for any planned stewardship/management.
  - f) Two four photos of the parcel suitable for use in outreach and reporting.

Following review of the application, the Committee may request additional information or a site visit. The Committee aims to finalize funding decisions within 4 weeks of the application deadline.

#### **Selection Criteria**

The following criteria will be used by the Committee to select projects for funding:

- Protection of land that is adjacent to and/or integral to an aquatic ecosystem (e.g. coastal, riverine,
- High habitat value(s) for fish, wildlife and/or plant communities
- Location and size of the project, as well as condition of surrounding land;
- Contiguous with other protected lands;
- Integral to a larger conservation vision;
- Cost-effectiveness of proposal, including matching funds;
- Level of threat from development;
- The potential impact of current uses and/or future land management practices on habitat values;
- Likelihood of successful implementation (including acquisition and long-term stewardship);
- Community sentiments toward the project, including public access considerations.

Habitat values will be analyzed and prioritized using a standardized set of maps prepared by USFWS Gulf of Maine Coastal Program, including:

- Beginning With Habitat (BWH) Riparian Resources
- BWH Resources as documented by MDIFW, Maine Natural Areas Program, Maine Dept. of Marine Resources and USFWS
- Regional conservation lands and BWH Undeveloped Habitat Blocks
- Parcel map on aerial imagery
- Nature's Network Conservation Design (naturesnetwork.org)

#### Applicants are also welcome, but not required, to submit additional information such as:

- Applicant-provided site environmental surveys
- Other GIS-based habitat analyses and models as available
- Local knowledge and site visit observations
