But when they get into our waters, they can also kill plants and animals that are not problems. Fish, lobsters, and aquatic insects are vulnerable to such chemicals.


As it does in a garden, fertilizer makes water plants grow in the Bay. Too much algae and aquatic plant growth can make boating, fishing, and swimming a slimy experience. But lawn and garden care doesn't have to be a problem. What to do?

Treat with care. Right dose at the right time.
