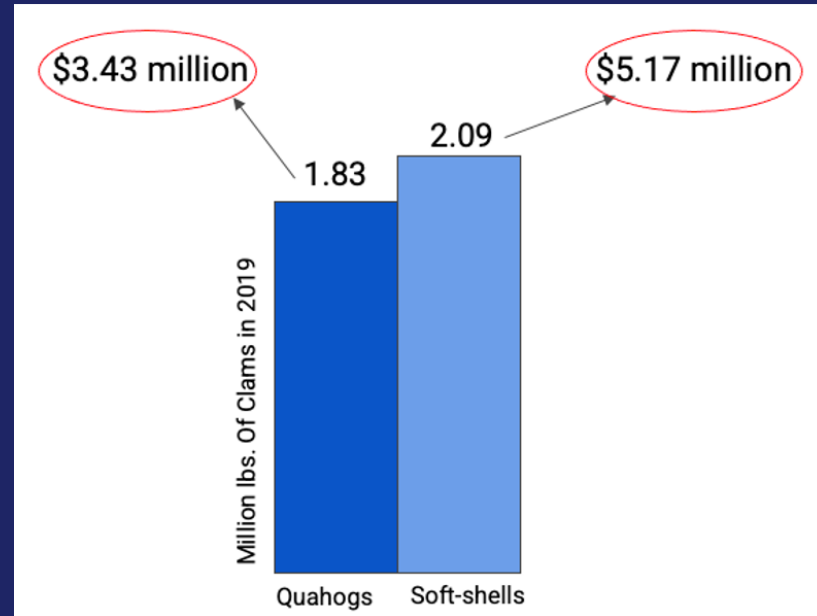

Importance of Shellfish in Casco Bay

Shellfish resources in the intertidal are of great importance:

- Ecologically
 - Water purification, protection from erosion, nutrient cycling
- Economically
 - Jobs, multiplier effect, tourism, restaurants
- Culturally
 - Wabanaki shell middens
 - 1640 Colonial shellfish ordinance

Issues facing the fishery

- Gulf of Maine is one of the fastest warming bodies of water
- Increased rate of clam predation by milky ribbon worms and green crabs
- Ocean acidification
- Water quality closures
 - ◆ Biotoxin, bacterial, and rainfall
- Limited entry fishery
 - ◆ Demand for licenses > supply
- Limited access to the intertidal
- Limited information for decision making, conservation, and monitoring at the municipal level



Casco Bay Regional Shellfish Working Group

Vision:

A healthy intertidal ecosystem that sustains shellfish resources and the jobs that depend on these fisheries.

Mission

Collaboratively address pressing issues facing the wild-harvest shellfish community and to share expertise and best practices for management, conservation, research, and monitoring across towns and stakeholders in Casco Bay, Maine.



Community Intertidal Data Portal

- GPCOG to support municipalities as a regional data clearinghouse
- Understanding the intertidal is key across stakeholder groups for:
 - Management of wild shellfish populations, their habitat, and harvester jobs
 - Climate change adaptation action planning
 - Access, development, and conservation questions that will have long lasting impacts
- When available, intertidal data may not be presented in ways that are understandable or actionable for a non-technical audience
 - Increase accessibility by providing data in centralized, up-to-date, visual format

Purpose

Primary goal: to help inform municipal coastal planning and climate change adaptation, with a focus on the intertidal ecosystem and shellfish conservation.

Secondary goal: is to inform research and monitoring in the intertidal zone, as the data portal will inform research priorities, siting for municipal conservation projects, and long-term monitoring.

Applications

Each tool will center around a specific management or planning question and incorporate data in a way that will facilitate action and decision making

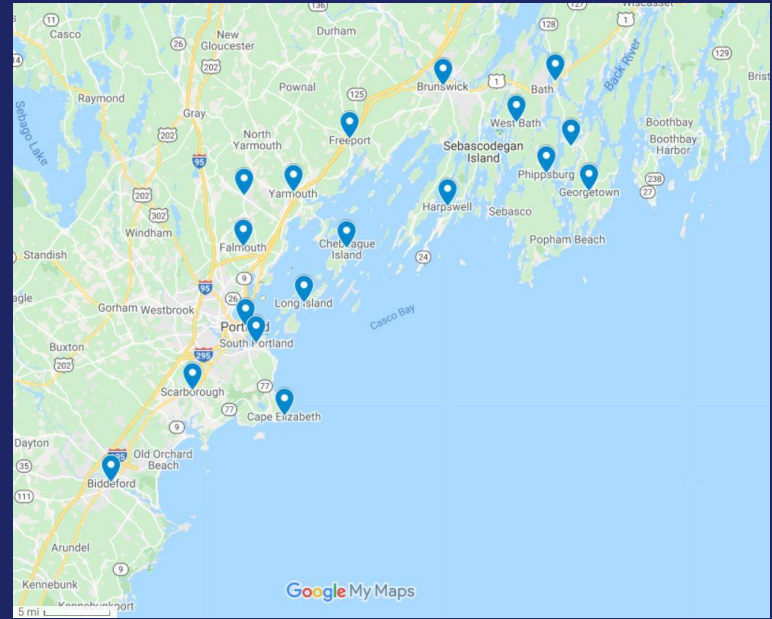
Future data products could focus on informing:

- Shellfish restoration
- Coastal permitting
- Coastal comprehensive planning
- Climate action planning and resilience
- Identifying key conservation areas



Data Portal Outreach

- Scope:
 - Stakeholders: shellfish community and municipal staff/committees involved in coastal planning
 - Geographic: intertidal zone within GPCOG and WG communities
- Surveys of the shellfish community and municipal staff/committees
- Group feedback sessions
