







Casco Bay Habitat Protection Fund Fall 2022 Request for Proposals

Overview

Casco Bay Estuary Partnership (CBEP) has allocated funding for the permanent protection of lands that are integral to aquatic ecosystems through the fall 2022 RFP of the *Casco Bay Habitat Protection Fund*. The RFP is in partnership with Maine Coast Heritage Trust (MCHT), Maine Dept. of Inland Fisheries & Wildlife (MaineDIFW), and U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, Gulf of Maine Coastal Program (USFWS).

This fund strategically supports land protection by paying for transaction costs, including boundary surveys, appraisals, legal fees, title research, environmental assessments, recording fees, and related "due diligence" expenses, which occur prior to the acquisition of conservation easements or fee ownership. As such, grants serve as seed money for fundraising, when there may be risk inherent to incurring expenses in order to develop a project. CBEP often provides letters of support to grantees.

Applicants are asked to provide related parcel lot/map information to CBEP by October 14, 2022. Completed proposals are due by November 16, 2022.

Fund Criteria

- 1. Projects must be located within the Casco Bay watershed (see map), including the Calendar Islands.
- 2. Proposals should target property with one or more of the following characteristics:
 - a. Shoreline on tidal waters, small coastal streams, rivers, or perennial streams.
 - b. Tidal wetlands, salt marsh migration corridors, and adjacent upland buffers.
 - c. Freshwater wetlands, including floodplains and naturally occurring vernal pools.
 - d. Beginning with Habitat Focus Areas (factsheets).
 - e. Conservation priorities identified by local, regional, or statewide habitat-focused plans.
- 3. Grants cover anticipated costs incurred between 10/1/2022 5/31/2023.
- 4. Funds must be invoiced no later than 5/31/2023.
- 5. Grants can be awarded to tax-exempt 501(c)(3) conservation organizations or units of government.
- 6. Individual conservation projects are eligible to receive up to two grants from the Fund.

Eligible Expenses

- 1. <u>Priority:</u> Early transaction costs such as boundary surveys, attorney fees, environmental assessments, appraisal costs, recording fees, title research, and related 'due diligence' expenses.
- 2. Secondary: Costs associated with purchasing or receiving a conservation easement.
- 3. <u>Ineligible</u>: Personnel costs, fee ownership acquisition costs, and long-term stewardship funds are ineligible for this round.
- 4. <u>Other</u>: Please contact CBEP for clarification, or if unusual circumstances are present that may warrant further consideration of strategic uses of funds.

Grant Amount

Proposals up to \$10,000 will be considered for this round. Actual grant awards may be lower, depending on the number and quality of proposals received.

CBEP Habitat Protection Committee

The CBEP Habitat Protection Committee, comprised of representatives from CBEP, USFWS, MaineDIFW and MCHT, evaluates proposals and provides recommendations to CBEP for allocation of funding.

Requirements for all Properties Protected

- 1. All lands protected must be managed for habitat conservation. The applicant must ensure permanent protection and management of the property for its natural resource values in perpetuity.
- 2. Public access, permitted in a manner sensitive to habitat values, must be assured in perpetuity due to the use of U.S. EPA federal funds. (NOTE: Rare exceptions may be granted where conservation value is especially high, and public access would undercut conservation goals.)
- 3. If intensive land management activities (e.g. forestry, agriculture) are envisioned on the property, those activities must be carried out in an ecologically sensitive manner, consistent with the overarching purpose of protecting high value habitat in perpetuity. Applicants anticipating intensive land management activities for non-habitat values must review these activities in the proposal and describe legal and other mechanisms for ensuring compliance with management goals.
- 4. In outreach efforts associated with land acquisition, CBEP will provide a logo and requests recognition as a partner involved in supporting the land protection initiative. In written materials, we request that "Casco Bay Habitat Protection Fund" be credited as co-administered in partnership with the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service Gulf of Maine Coastal Program, Maine Coast Heritage Trust, and the Maine Dept. of Inland Fisheries & Wildlife.
- 5. Although it is not a requirement to receive a grant through the Fund, the provision of non-federal matching funds for CBEP's federal contribution to any project is strongly encouraged. This commitment will need to be documented in writing on the organization's letterhead.

Application Process

The process for applying is as follows:

- Interested parties should notify CBEP and provide tax parcel lot/map information by 10/14/2022. U.S.
 Fish and Wildlife Service, Gulf of Maine Coastal Program will then prepare a set of maps on a first
 come/first served basis. Maps will be provided to applicants for use in developing proposals.
- Applicants should submit an electronic copy of the following items to CBEP by 11/15/2022.
 - a) Cover letter briefly describing project and requesting funds;
 - b) A completed Habitat Protection Fund application OR a pre-existing grant application with supplemental information as needed (especially p.1 of the HPF application form);
 - c) Series of habitat maps prepared by USFWS, as described above;
 - d) An appraisal summary sheet or opinion of value, if available;
 - e) Budget outlining the total project costs, committed funds, and potential funding sources (both for the project and for any planned stewardship/management); and,
 - f) A few photos of the parcel suitable for use in CBEP outreach and reporting (provide credits).

Following review of the application, the Committee may request a site visit. The Committee aims to finalize funding decisions within 3-4 weeks of the application deadline.

Selection Criteria

The following criteria will be used by the Committee to select projects for funding:

- Protection of land that is adjacent to and/or integral to an aquatic ecosystem (e.g. coastal, riverine,
- High habitat value(s) for fish, wildlife and/or plant communities
- Location and size of the project, as well as condition of surrounding land;
- Contiguous with other protected lands;
- Integral to a larger conservation vision;
- Cost-effectiveness of proposal, including matching funds;
- Level of threat from development;
- The potential impact of current uses and/or future land management practices on habitat values;
- Likelihood of successful implementation (including acquisition and long-term stewardship);
- Community sentiments toward the project, including public access considerations.

Habitat values will be analyzed and prioritized using a standardized set of maps prepared by USFWS Gulf of Maine Coastal Program, including:

- Beginning With Habitat (BWH) Riparian Resources
- BWH Resources as documented by Maine DIFW, Maine Natural Areas Program, Maine Dept. of Marine Resources and USFWS
- Regional conservation lands and BWH Undeveloped Habitat Blocks
- Parcel map on aerial imagery
- Nature's Network Conservation Design (naturesnetwork.org)

Applicants are also welcome, but not required, to submit additional information such as:

- Applicant-provided site environmental surveys
- Other GIS-based habitat analyses and models as available
- Local knowledge and site visit observations
